

Emergency Medical Services Courses

EMT-Basic

Emergency Medical Technicians provide pre-hospital patient care for the sick and injured. This 130-hour program prepares students to become certified by Ohio and the National Registry of EMT's. The curriculum includes Patient Assessment, Airway & Breathing, Circulation, Musculoskeletal/Behavioral, Obstetrics/Infants, EMS Systems, Legal, Communications and Documentation. Program includes 10 hours field clinical experience.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS: WorkKeys Assessment - Locating Information and Mathematics. Health - Able to perform essential functions, Hepatitis B Immunizations, MMR Immunizations, Current negative TB test.

EMT-Intermediate

The 110-hour Intermediate EMT course teaches the student advanced airway management, pharmacology, cardiac care, intravenous and interosseous therapy and other advanced patient management techniques required to become certified by The State of Ohio.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS: WorkKeys Assessment, EMT-Basic knowledge evaluation, Hepatitis B immunization, current negative TB test, MMR Immunization

EMT-Basic Refresher

EMT Refresher courses are required for certification renewal in lieu of continuing education and for candidates who have not passed their National Registry Examination after three attempts. Reviews the skills and theory covered in the EMT Basic.
30 hours

EMT-Intermediate Refresher

Reviews EMT-Intermediate skills and knowledge - provides mandated topics toward the EMT-I's certification renewal. Additional continuing education required.

Reminder: All Ohio EMT-I's should have completed the Transition Course prior to July 1, 2005. Ohio EMT-I's not having completed this course should contact the Ohio Division of EMS for direction.
